	them. Describe how Sarah used these three teaching techniques to ensure she was an effective workshop leader?

- 2. a) Identify the characteristics of musical theatre dance.
  - b) Describe the function that dance plays in a musical theatre production.
- 3. Compare scenes from the following three musicals: \_\_\_\_\_\_, \_\_\_\_\_, and \_\_\_\_\_\_? Explain the emphasis/purpose of dance in each of the productions.
- 4. Identify and explain some features and movements of the Musical Theatre dance style that are common with other dance styles.
- 5. a) The musical GREASE uses a variety of social dances from that time period. List some examples of social dance that were incorporated into the dance workshop choreography you learned.
  - b) What social dances exist in society today?
  - c) What social dance do you, or others your age, take part in, and how is that dance a reflection of the society in which you live?



- 6. a) What message is conveyed with a lower gaze during a performance?
  - b) What message is conveyed by an alert, focused expression?
  - c) Which message would be more appropriate to this musical theatre performance?
- 7. How does character play a role in the performance of this musical theatre dance composition?
- 8. a) How can technical skill and expressiveness work together to create an outstanding performance? Can you have one without the other? Explain.
  - b) Have you ever seen or performed in a dance that was lacking in one of those areas? What could you do to correct the imbalance?
  - c) What is required to make the dance composition you learned from this workshop an outstanding performance?
- 9. What are the challenges of transitioning from one movement to the next? What strategies do you use to maintain a smooth flow of movement during transitions?



- 10. How will you make sure you accurately reproduce the movements that make up this dance when performing it alone or with other students?
- 11. What type of behaviour will show the teacher, your classmates, or the audience that you are fully engaged in your rehearsal or performance?
- 12. How will you apply what you have learned in this workshop and rehearsal process in future group collaborations with your classmates?
- a) Explain how you would apply elements of stagecraft (lighting, sound/music, costume, hair, make-up, and setting) to the performance of this musical theatre dance composition if you were going to present it to a live audience or on video.
  - b) Explain why you would make those stagecraft choices (lighting, sound/music, costumes, makeup, hair and stage set) to enhance your dance movements.
- 14. a) What have you learned about yourself through participation in dance so far?
  - b) Could you learn those things through other activities? Why or why not?
  - c) Explain how participation in dance can contribute to a sense of belonging or community.
- 15. Is it possible to 'borrow' an idea and make it your own without directly copying or plagiarizing?
