

WELCOME and INTRODUCTION (4:30)

Ryan: Hi, I'm Ryan Brown and I will be your host for Ontario Secondary School DANCEFEST 2022. I am an alumnus of Bluevale Collegiate in Waterloo and first attended DANCEFEST in Barrie, in 2005. Just to note that one of our adjudicators, Sarah Vance, also attended that event. It just goes to show you that dancers love DANCEFEST and many of us come back year after year to support and see the amazing artistry that this festival showcases.

Aside from teaching musical theatre and tap workshops, I have had the awesome opportunity to host DANCEFEST from 2017 until our last live event before COVID in 2019 when it was held at St. Clair College, Centre for the Performing Arts in Windsor. In 2020 and 2021, we were virtual and although we are virtual again this year, we are thrilled to share that our numbers have doubled from last year's event. So, thank you dancers for sharing your original choreography with us. And, thank you teachers for supporting your students to join us this year. Given the uncertainities and changing protocols, virtual was the only option to showcase the amazing artistry of your participants. So, on behalf of OSSDF, thank you for your commitment to this second virtual DANCEFEST that celebrates our 20th anniversary.

DANCEFEST began in 2003 with 125 dancers from nine schools. The founding schools that celebrated dance together at Bluevale CI were: BCI, Waterloo; Chatham Kent SS, Chatham; Eastwood CI, Kitchener; Forest Heights CI, Kitchener; Philip Pocock SS; Mississauga; St. Michael's SS, Stratford; St. Thomas of Villanova, Windsor; Ursuline Collegiate, Chatham; and Widdifield SS, North Bay.

Most of the dance teachers from those schools met in Toronto during the winter of 2002 at a DANCE AQ course taught by Jocelyn Bell. Their goal to bring students from across the province together to collaborate and celebrate original dance artistry grew into what we honour today. Four of the original teachers remain active advocates and supporters of DANCEFEST today: Laurel Brown, formerly from Bluevale, Waterloo; Tara Duffy, from SATEC, Toronto; Melissa Chiandussi, from St. Joseph's, Windsor; and, Jocelyn Bell-Summersby, from West Ferris and formerly from Widdifield North Bay.

The philosophy established by the founding teachers has not changed over the 20 years...DANCEFEST validates the artistry of all our students, collaborates and shares learning, encourages respect amongst all dancers, and empowers students to improve and grow as dancers in an inclusive and diverse community.

Between 2003 and 2019, 5,634 students attended in-person DANCEFEST events that were held across the province in Waterloo, North Bay, Barrie, Windsor, Chatham, and Niagara Falls. In 2020, we were unfortunately forced to cancel our in-person event, but continued virtually in 2021 with 105 dancers from 9 schools sharing 38 dance pieces. We were smaller, but we were passionate and vibrant! We are happy to share that this year, we have 248 dancers from 11 schools performing 85 wonderful and creative dance pieces. BRAVO dancers!!!

OSSDF looks forward to returning to our in-person event next year - OSSDF2023 - and having the opportunity, once again, to gather, share original choreography, and celebrate this spectacular event while keeping DANCE vital in education. We plan to incorporate a virtual component into our live event next year to maintain participation of those schools who are challenged by distance to attend.

I would like to thank this year's DANCEFEST Board of Directors for their efforts to continue making dance accessible to all students, and for supporting teachers in remote and in-person learning. Sarah Vance

Sarah Vance attended **OSSDF2019** as an adjudicator and workshop leader. A creative powerhouse, **Sarah** is a choreographer and triple threat performer from Waterloo, Ontario. Most recently, she choreographed the short film, **Chris.Mrs**, and was the Associate Choreographer for **Grease the Musical** in Toronto. Other choreography credits include: **The Moblees** - Season 2 (CBC), **Ukelele U** - Pilot Episode (CBC) and **American Idiot** (Lower Ossington Theatre).

With a love for theatre, Sarah has established herself as an industry elite in the musical theatre world. Select theatre credits include: *Anne of Green Gables, Mamma Mia, Alice Through The Looking Glass, Canada Rocks!* (Charlottetown Festival), *Hairspray, Grease, Elf the Musical, All Shook Up, Spamalot,*

High School Musical (Drayton Entertainment), Crazy For You (Theatre Calgary/Citadel Theatre), Beauty and the Beast, Music Man (Capitol Theatre), Grease the Musical (Elgin and Winter Garden Theatre Toronto) and Romeo and Juliet Remixed – Workshop (Stratford Festival). In between theatre contracts, Sarah has also accumulated impressive credits in the film and television industry.

Sarah graduated from *York University* with an *Honours Science Kinesiology Degree* and is a *Registered Kinesiologist*. During her studies she was a member of the *NBA Toronto Raptors Dance Pak* for four seasons, dancing in front of 20,000 fans. More recently, Sarah dances with 8 month old son, Hunter, while triple threat hubby David Cotton sings along.



Cathy Harris

Dance is Cathy Harris' passion and she has enjoyed being part of the dance community for over 40 years. She started as a Modern dancer/teacher with Gina Lori Dance Enterprise in Windsor which provided lecture demonstrations, performances and workshops in Ontario, Quebec, and Michigan.

The onset of secondary school dance curricula in the late nineties led Cathy to a teaching position with the Windsor Essex Catholic District School Board. One of Cathy's career highlights was being involved with DANCEFEST beginning in 2004, bringing students to the event, leading workshops, hosting the annual event and, following incorporation in 2015, as a board member from 2018-2020.

In 2009, Cathy was asked to teach the Additional Qualifications course for dance at the University of Windsor. The twelve years

of course development and delivery allowed her the opportunity to share her passion with dance educators from many areas of Ontario.

In her retirement, Cathy continues to share her passion for dance and is pleased to have the opportunity to adjudicate at Let's Dis-DANCE Again!



Edward Daranyi

In his 19 seasons at The Stratford Festival, Edward has served as Assistant Director of Oklahoma!, A Delicate Balance, Oliver!, Ghosts, The Lark, Quiet in the Land, The Count of Monte Cristo, and Associate Director of King Henry VIII, The Donnellys: Sticks & Stones, and West Side Story with many others including Nunsense, Baby, Six for Song, Little Shop of Horrors, On Golden Pond and, The World Festival of Children's Theatre.

Mr. Daranyi has also acted as the Associate Director of Education for Stratford, and the company's resident teaching artist. He has spent time with the artistic leadership at the Festival as Associate Director of New Play Development, and

the Associate Director of Casting.

Edward co-created a landmark multi-disciplined adaptation of Romeo and Juliet, a hearing/deaf multilingual experiment, with Shakespeare Link Canada. He continues to work with artists in El Salvador in partnership with The Stratford Festival and CUSO International.

Edward has taught at the University of Guelph, the National Theatre School of Canada, Humber College, George Brown College, The Centre for Indigenous Theatre, Cawthra Park School for the Arts and the National Ballet School of Canada.

More recently Edward has moved online to support both Teachers and Students through e-learning platforms during the pandemic. His production company, In the Blink, produces youth-oriented theatre in the Toronto area.



"Lots of potential!" Did we ever think that later that same year Tessa and her partner, Scott Moir, would rank Junior Ice Dance National Champions. I understand she found out rather late that she would be free to go to DANCEFEST and quickly choreographed a solo. She came to North Bay on the bus with her class, performed on the first day and left afterwards because she had practice on the ice the following day. She was an excellent and disciplined student, an extraordinary dancer and a world class ice dancer. We were so fortunate that she could make the time to come and be with her friends and share her artistry with us at DANCEFEST2004. (1:38)

Ryan: DANCEFEST has always provided a unique opportunity where students with passion for dance are able to perform in a supportive, encouraging environment. Even if dancers have formal training, few have choreographed. We honour the artistry, cultural expression, and creative performances shared by these wonderful, active and creative students. In addition, we are proud of the confidence they gain in their mental and physical wellbeing from the empowering and positive feedback shared by everyone in attendance including our workshop artists.

OSSDF has been fortunate to collaborate with many professional dance artists during COVID to bring dance virtually into classrooms and homes. Dance, always a creative form of expression, has been even more essential during these challenging times so we **thank** all those wonderful dance artists who danced *for* us. Their offerings form OSSDF's **eduDANCEon!** educational resources.

In our second year, we now have 30 workshops provided by talented dance artists and educators that have been shared with more than 5,500 individual students from 29 different school boards in Ontario. Workshops that began with Musical Theatre, Contemporary, Hip Hop, Jazz Funk, Tap and Ballet, have grown to include Bollywood, Classical Latin, Beginner Heels, Lyrical, Ballroom, Yoga, Stretch & Strength, and many more. We have also shared lectures and live workshops of the Creative Process, Annemarie Cabri's Brain and Body Boost, Deb Kapp's Action Pak d'Action, Fariya Doctor's Breathing Through A Mask, and Maggie Forgeron's Expressive Arts. We couldn't have compiled and shared these workshops had it not been for

the kindness and generosity of our dance artists to support our youth. Their interest to "pass it forward" has allowed us to **Dis-DANCE**, together, in celebration of our shared passion.
